## Youth Music Conference on Saturday December 4, 2010

Young musicians aged 12 - 24 are invited to attend an upcoming Youth Music Conference set to take place at Fairfield RSL on Saturday 4 December 2010. The event will attract up to 100 young artists with the aim to train them with skills to manage their performing arts careers, engage with the community and build their capacity to survive within the music industry.

The initiative is a partnership between Fairfield City Council, Holroyd Youth Services and the Youth Underground Music Project (Miller), and aims to engage young artists from across Western Sydney.

The event will mark the commencement of the Technology Arts Music & Entertainment Program, that will be delivered in the months prior to the Bring it On! Youth Festival (10 April 2011). The conference will be a one day exploration of musical participation for young people: from developing industry skills and knowledge, to participating in performance master classes and networking with other artists.
